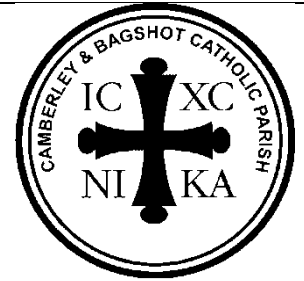

On Thursday after Ash Wednesday the Parish enjoyed the first of the series of talks by 'Catholic Voices', a talk entitled 'How to defend your faith without raising your voice.' Sue Petriz, a parishioner of Crawley Parish and a Family Law Solicitor, discussed the technique of 'Reframing,' whereby a contentious topic in conversation is 'Reframed' by finding common ground with the person with whom the Catholic is engaging. The speaker reminded the audience that in such conversations the person will not necessarily remember what was said, but will certainly remember how they were made to feel. Pope St John Paul II reminded the Catholic faithful that "...for the disciple of Christ, to evangelise is an obligation of love", an obligation that is always to be undertaken in a spirit of charity. Sue Petriz encouraged the audience by saying that if she, an ordinary Catholic, could fruitfully engage in such conversations, then so could other ordinary Catholics. Whilst 'defending the faith' has traditionally been seen as a task for bishops and priests, the contemporary Church in England is rediscovering that this task falls to all of the faithful. The apostolate of Catholic Voices is to enable and encourage Ordinary Lay Catholics to live out more faithfully the rights and duties they received at baptism, and in the Season of Lent we are especially encouraged to reflect on what it means to be baptised. The second talk in the series is entitled 'Is the Church anti-science?' and will take place on Thursday 16th March at 8pm at St Tarcisius Hall. All are welcome to attend.
