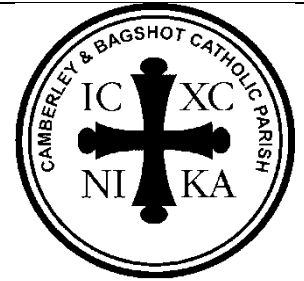

Last Thursday the Parish heard the second in the Lenten series of talks by Catholic Voices, to help Catholics 'defend the Faith without shouting.' This talk was given by Caroline Farrow, a member of the Parish of Ash and well known as a Catholic Voice on social media, who spoke on the subject 'Is the Church Anti-Science?' Farrow explained that the Church is often perceived as anti-science, and that Catholics can sometimes find themselves in contentious discussions on this theme. Rather than argue back, the first step is to find common ground with the other person, which is that both parties are in a common search to understand the truth. Having 'reframed' the debate one can then show that science and faith are two distinct modes of enquiry; science seeks to understand the world around us through empirical observation, whereas faith seeks to answer the questions as to why we are here, what are we to do, what can we hope for? History also shows us not only that many scientists were and are devout Christian believers, but that science needed the foundation of a Christian culture in order to take root and flourish in the 16th century. The third talk in this Lenten series takes place this Thursday at 8pm at St Tarcisius Hall on the subject 'What's wrong with assisted suicide?' All welcome.
