The 22nd October would be the feast of St John Paul II but the liturgy for the 29th Sunday of the year. Having just been on a pilgrimage to Krakow, Poland, it reminded me of his impact on our church and the world. One of the places that we visited was Wadowice where Karol Wojtyla was born in 1920. The family home which is next the parish church has been turned into an impressive museum. It was evident how the culture and history of the Polish people had formed him and shaped his pontificate. His devotion to Our Lady was made more poignant by the death of this mother at a young age. "Totus Tuus" was Saint John Paul II's apostolic motto. It means "totally thine" and expressed his personal consecration to Mary. As a young priest Fr Wojtyla loved to spend time in the Teras Mountains especially with young people and this was the inspiration of the international World Youth Days. It was on 22nd October that Cardinal Wojtyla was elected pope and took the name John Paul II. Before he gave his blessing John Paul II said "Praised be Jesus Christ! .. the cardinals have called a new bishop of Rome.. ... from a far-away country...far, but always near in the communion of faith and the Christian tradition. I introduce myself to you all, to confess our common faith, our hope, our trust in the Mother of Christ and of the Church, and to begin again on this path of history. with the help of God."
