

PRAY FOR CAMBERLEY On the evening of Tuesday 06/Dec, we had our fourth evening of prayer at St. Martin's Church on the Old Dean as part of Churches Together in Camberley's **#PrayForCamberley series**.

Similar to previous evenings, starting with tea/coffee and a social time, we met members of other congregations in Camberley. Rev. Chris Richardson spoke initially and shared how, through a strong foundation of ongoing prayer, the



congregation at St. Martin's had focussed on serving the local community. Partnering with the Old Dean Community Group, St. Martin's had set up a **weekly Free Food Stall** to help with food poverty which has been running for over two years St. Martin's also has renewed interest in Christianity with several people returning or joining the worshipping community. Following a time of worship, we broke up into small groups to pray together either out loud or silently. The themes included praying for encounters with those in our community, supporting those in desperate need and the mission of our churches over Christmas. The next prayer evening is currently being planned for February or March. The exact date and location once confirmed will be published via the parish newsletter. We are partnering with St. Martin's on collecting non-perishable food which you can leave in the box at the rear of Christ the King / Sts. Peter & John / St. Tarcisius churches.

Remembrance Poppy Display

The parish poppy memorial display which was created by; Anna Cassidy, Tani Shreeve, Angela Sutton, Charlotte Neep, Frances Conolly, Rosemarie Weneden, Anne Nash, Norah Ratcliffe, Kathy Conroy, Elaine D'Souza and Sandie O'Hanlon, went on display for the first time in November. 2022. The fishing net is representative of Christ who was the fisher of men and it was fitting that those brave souls who lost their life for the good of mankind should be remembered in this way. Parishioners were able to make a dona-



tion to SAAFA whilst hooking a poppy on the display to represent a deceased loved one. These poppies will be sewn into the display before the next Remembrance Sunday. Over £75 was raised for SAAFA.





After midday Mass at Ss Peter & John church on a cold December day about 40 parishioners were welcomed to a soup lunch prepared by the CAFOD group. They enjoyed a variety of delicious homemade soups and a chance to chat to fellow parishioners and friends. Donations given for the CAFOD Afghanistan crisis appeal amounted to £600 making the total for 2022 for Afghanistan £2535. This total includes £825 donations from the CAFOD 'pyramid' boxes. Many thanks to the parish for their support.
